
Dawkins. Many thanks to them for an important program on CPR and the Heimlich Maneuver (and thanks for the door prizes from Kim!).


Please be thinking about the Gardener of the Year selection. Send your nominations to Jim Drummond or to me, and refer to the new guidelines of page 3 of this newsletter.

Important Agenda Items for March Meeting

We'll be discussing the upcoming annual Mebane Dogwood Festival for April. As in past years Dudley will be distributing 20 raffles tickets to each paid member to sell prior to or at the festival. Our program will be "Using Pots in the Landscape" by Chester Honeycutt. Please note that is "pots" - plural—just so you aren't confused about the illegal stuff in the garden.

The Gardener of the Year (GOY) Committee has finalized the guidelines (below) approved by the club last year on July 25. Per the guidelines the current nominating committee members for 2018 will be Bob Held (2017), Dirk Sprenger (2016) and Ray Schwartz (2015).

Guidelines (not rules) for Selecting Gardener of the Year For Men's Garden Club of Burlington

- The nominating committee shall be the last three winners that are still members of MGCOB
- The nominating committee shall be in place at the beginning of the year so they can be evaluating as the year progresses receiving the *Seedling* and club minutes will be extremely helpful
- The "Year" in Gardener of the year shall begin May 1st and end on April 30th
- The selection of GOY shall take place at the May meeting to be presented at the June Picnic
- A member can be considered for the honor regardless of how long he has been a member (i.e. If someone joins in say September he can be eligible for the award in May of next year)
- A member cannot be considered for the award if he was one of the last five winners (winners before the last five years can be selected as GOY)
- Since it is "Gardener of the Year" When evaluating a member for GOY:
 - Emphasis should be placed on activities during the last year May 1st through April 30th
 - Should the need arise (there is no one eligible with a lot of participation) activities from prior years may be considered
- Self-nominations and floor nominations will be encouraged
- If the committee determines that there is a clear candidate, it is not necessary to nominate more than one candidate since nominations may be made both by one's self and from the floor
